## **Emerging Varieties Challenge 2021**

### **2021 Conditions**

Queensland Wine Industry Association Incorporated (QWIA), the organizer of the Queensland and Australian International Emerging Variety Wine Show (the Awards), is the voluntary, non-profit association that conducts and provides strategic direction to the Awards. The Association appoints an organizing committee to oversee and manage all aspects of the Awards processes.

The aim of the Queensland and Australian International Emerging Variety Wine Challenge is to highlight the quality of our Emerging Varieties in comparison with International Wines from the Country and Region of Origin of the particular variety. This is done via the formal judging of bottled wine by respected, experienced show judges. Show results are disseminated back exhibitors and the industry, with the intent of improving quality in viticulture and wine production. QWIA recognizes the role of the consumer by also disseminating results to them and providing opportunities for the consumer to taste and purchase wines.

All wines entered must be commercially available to purchase at the time of entry or must be able to be purchased commercially in the future, in the case of wines not yet released. It is not the purpose of the Awards to judge wines that are sold out or no longer available for commercial sales.

QWIA recognizes the complexity of arrangements within an awards system and acknowledges that a rule cannot be made to cover every conceivable circumstance. These Awards will be conducted within both the spirit and the letter of the Regulations below. Exhibitors and exhibits may be subject to audit by QWIA before and award is finalised.

### **Wine Judging**

Judging will be by panels of three independent judges selected by the organizer in consultation with the Chief Judge.

The organizer may choose to appoint associate judges to each panel. Exhibitors may be associate judges.

### **Results**

Trophy, Medal and other Award results will be announced at the presentation function advised in the Schedule.

As soon as practicable after the presentation function, results will be posted on QWIA's website [www.queenslandwine.com.au](http://www.queenslandwine.com.au).

## **1. Eligibility & Volume Requirements**

**1.1** Emerging Varieties for the purpose of this Challenge are those considered non mainstream and are in the minority wine grape plantings in Australia. (please direct any queries to Chief Steward)

**1.2** Blends containing only emerging varieties may be entered.

**1.3** All exhibits must confirm to the respective acts of the State and Commonwealth Governments and relevant Food Standards Acts, which govern the manufacture of Australian wine. Judges and stewards reserve the right to have any exhibit inspected and/or analysed. Wines will conform to the Label Integrity Program in Australian Wine and Brandy Corporation Act 1980 (Part VIA, Sections 39A – 39ZL).

**1.4** Each exhibit must be a bottled, finished wine. Only wines from a commercial bottling run are to be entered – it is not the purpose of the Challenge to judge barrel or tank samples.

**1.5** All wines entered must be commercially available to purchase at the time of entry or must be able to be purchased commercially in the future, in the case of wines not yet released. It is not the purpose of the Challenge to judge wines that are sold out or no longer available for commercial sales.

**1.8** The organizer or an authorized representative of the organizer may conduct a random audit of exhibits. These may be conducted before or after judging. The organisers reserve the right to examine records of any wine entered to ensure compliance with stock on hand and commercial availability requirements.

## **2. Entry Process**

**2.1** Entry fees must be paid at the time of entry and are due by 5pm on the date advised in the Schedule. The organizer reserves the right to refuse any nomination form received after this date, or any nomination form with fees unpaid by this date. “Fees unpaid” is taken to mean the absence of payments, underpayment, or partial payment of the correct fee, as specified in 2.2.

**2.2** The basic entry fee is \$48 (GST inclusive) per exhibit. This is discounted to \$39 (GST inclusive) if the exhibitor is a current financial member of the Queensland Wine Industry Association (QWIA). The organizer will obtain confirmation of financial membership of each exhibitor so claiming and that the organisers decision is final. All entry fees must be paid prior to judging or wines will not be included for judging.

**2.3** For each exhibit, the year of vintage and state grown must be shown on the entry form.

**2.4** For Blends Submitted, varietal percentage split must be provided on the Entry Form.

**2.5** The number of bottles of each exhibit required to be supplied for CLASSES is four (4)

**2.6** Commercially labelled bottles are preferred. Exhibits must be in the same size bottle in which the wine is normally marketed. Entries with insufficient bottles will be disqualified. Wines that are not commercially labelled must be marked clearly (please use block letters with the Vintage, commercial name of the wine, varietal, or blend, where applicable, and the alcohol content.

**2.7** No show labels will be provided. A completed Entry Details Slip is to be submitted with each carton of wine showing the wine name, class and vintage and State Grown.

**2.8** All exhibits become the property of the organizer and cannot be removed from the possession of the organizer without permission from the Chief Stewart.

**2.9** Wine must be delivered by the date stated above.

**2.10** Each carton must be labelled with the Delivery Address Label show in the Schedule.

### **3. Classes**

3.1. Wine will be judged in the following classes:

#### **Classes**

1. Italian White Varieties
2. Iberian White Varieties (Portugal and Spain)
3. Rest of the World White Varieties
4. Italian Red Varieties
5. Iberian Red Varieties
6. Rest of the World Red Varieties

### **4. Awards**

**4.1** Certificates awarded to Gold, Silver and Bronze Medal wines

**4.2** Scoring system: ASVO Protocol

**4.3** A Trophy may not be awarded if there is no eligible wine of gold medal standard.

**4.4** To be eligible for a Queensland Award you must meet the following criteria:

- Hold a valid Queensland Wine Producer's Licence

- Wine must be grown and made in Queensland

**4.5** Plaques will be awarded to the following:

Queensland - Best Italian White Variety

Queensland - Best Iberian White Variety

Queensland - Best Rest of the World White Variety

Queensland - Best Italian Red Variety

Queensland - Best Iberian White Variety

Queensland - Best Rest of the World Red Variety

Open - Best Italian White Variety

Open - Best Iberian White Variety

Open - Best Rest of the World White Variety

Open - Best Italian Red Variety

Open - Best Iberian Red Variety

Open - Best Rest of the World Red Variety

Champion - Queensland White

**5. Wine Judging**

**5.1** Judging will be by panels of three independent judges selected by the organizer in consultation with the Chief Judge. No person who is an exhibitor may occupy the position of judge.

**5.2** The organizer may choose to appoint associate judges to each panel. Exhibitors may be associate judges.

**5.3** It shall be at the sole discretion of the judges that any award be made.

**5.4** All exhibits will be judged as follows:

**5.5** The judges reserve the right to disqualify or dismiss as not being eligible for judging any exhibit that in their opinion does not comply with regulations in any way. Such disqualification shall be considered final. Disqualification for any reason may, at the sole discretion of the organizer, rule the exhibitor ineligible for entry in future awards.

**5.6** All Australian wines will be judged and benchmarked against wines from the place of origin, where the variety began. Eg. Nebbiolo – Barolo, Albarino - Spain

6.1 Trophy and Plaque Award results will be announced at the presentation function advised in the Schedule.

## **7 Cancellation and Returns Policy**

All wine entries remain the property of the Queensland and Australian International Emerging Variety Challenge/ Queensland Wine Industry Association.

Cancellation:

Should the Queensland and Australian International Emerging Variety Wine Challenge be cancelled after wine has been received, wines will be returned to the nominated business.

Postponed:

Should the Queensland and Australian International Emerging Variety Wine Challenge be postponed for any reason, all wine will remain the property of the Queensland Wine Industry Association and held in storage to be presented at the new date.

Non-Payment of Fees:
